#### CALL FOR PAPERS

The Gendarmerie and Coast Guard Academy (GCGA) organizes the "*International Security Symposium: Security Perspective in the Century of Türkiye from 1923 to 2023*" on May 8-9, 2024. The aim of the symposium is to academically examine security issues that directly impact the mission areas of the Gendarmerie and Coast Guard organizations, which play a crucial role in establishing public safety, law and order in our country. The another aim of the symposium is facilitate idea exchange among researchers conducting studies in the field and to pioneer interdisciplinary studies.

The symposium is open to participation by academics and researchers from both domestic and international institutions who are interested in the subject. *The International Security Symposium: Security Perspective in the Century of Türkiye from 1923 to 2023* will take place at the GCGA Beytepe Campus (face-to-face), and participants from abroad can choose to present their papers either online (via video conference) or offline (by sending a video recording).

The symposium will be conducted in Turkish and English, with simultaneous translation provided for both languages. Participation in the symposium is free of charge. The symposium will be executed under the following headings:

## **APPLICATION AND PARTICIPATION CONDITIONS**

- Abstracts prepared within the framework of the symposium topics should be submitted to the email address **jsgasempozyum2024@gmail.com** in \*.doc or \*.docx format by **March 01, 2024**, by adding them to the **Abstract Submission Form**.
- The paper and research submitted to the symposium must not have been presented or published anywhere before.
- The symposium is open to the participation of academicians, postgraduate students, researchers, and experts from both domestic and international backgrounds who are related to the subject. The language of the symposium is Turkish and English, and simultaneous translation will be provided.
- Abstracts should be between **400-750** words and should include the purpose, method, summaries, methodology, conceptual framework, findings, conclusions, and keywords of the research. Abstracts must be written in both Turkish and English. There is no obligation to write the full text of the paper in English.
- Abstracts and papers should be prepared in accordance with the writing rules. Abstracts and papers that do not comply with the writing rules will not be considered for evaluation.
- Abstracts will be evaluated by members of the Scientific Committee through a 'blind peer-review' process, taking into account criteria such as compliance with symposium topics, scientific conditions, and the originality of the study.
- Each paper in the program will be allocated a total of 20 minutes, with 15 minutes for presentation and 5 minutes for discussion.
- A booklet containing the abstracts of the accepted papers will be prepared in electronic format and published on the symposium page.
- Participants who submit the abstract and full paper to the Organizing Committee or send them to the symposium email address are considered to have given permission for the publication of the abstract and full paper.
- No fees will be charged from the participants.

## **FULL PAPER SUBMISSION**

- Submission of full papers is optional and at the discretion of the authors.
- Full papers accepted through the 'blind peer-review' system during the symposium will be published either as national articles in the 2024 Special Issue of the GCGA Journal of

Security Sciences or as chapters in an international scientific book, upon the authors' request. When submitting their full papers, authors should specify their preferred publication option.

- Papers that were not presented during the symposium will not be considered for full paper evaluation.
- Authors must submit their full papers, prepared in accordance with the publication guidelines of the Jandarma and Coast Guard Academy Journal of Security Sciences (<https://www.jsga.edu.tr/gbd/makale-yazim-esaslari>), in \*.doc or \*.docx format via email to **jsgasempozyum2024@gmail.com** by **March 01, 2024**.
